Legislative Update

Week of March 1, 2021

This week at the legislature was business as usual. Beyond appropriations subcommittee presentations and action upon a handful of local bills, members were largely focused on another COVID relief measure. House Bill 196, 2021 COVID-19 Response & Relief, was introduced Monday and moved swiftly through both chambers and their respective committees in only four days. The \$1.7B relief package directing the allocation of federal funds now awaits Governor Cooper's signature. Next, the General Assembly will shift its focus towards developing the state's FY 2021-23 biennium budget.

The Joint Appropriations on Justice and Public Safety Committee, commonly referred to as JPS Appropriations, met again Tuesday and Thursday of this week. On Tuesday, Chief Deputy Secretary Tim Moose and Commissioner of Prisons Todd Ishee briefed committee members on the *NAACP v. Cooper* settlement, and Fiscal Research Division staff provided presentations on Prisons and Community Corrections. Members received an overview of Juvenile Justice, which included an update on Raise the Age implementation, on Thursday. The JPS Appropriations committee is expected to hear overview presentations next week on DPS law enforcement divisions, including Alcohol Law Enforcement, State Bureau of Investigation, State Capitol Police, and State Highway Patrol.
