The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2026-2027 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2026. The use of these funds in this county require a local match in the amount specified below. The county can approve programs for 1 or 2 year funding awards, dependent on county approval and programs meeting all requirements.

Local match rate for JCPC funds required: 10%.

Based on identified needed programs and possible gaps in the service continuum, the following program types will be considered for funding:

As a result of the Needs Assessment in the above-named county, programs that reduce risk, address the needs of juveniles, and increase protective factors will be considered for funding.

Elevated Risk and Needs for Court Involved Juveniles:

Programs that help support positive parenting and supervisory skills, also it was noted this year that numbers were elevated in relation to association with negative and gang involved peers, gang intervention and prevention, school attendance, and employment for juvenile was low.

Only local public agencies, 501c3 non-profit corporations and local housing authorities will be considered for funding.
