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
NC Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) Presentation

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What is the YRBS?

- NC conducted at **middle** and **high school** levels
 - Administered in odd years in NC since 1993
- All schools and classes are **randomly selected**
- Participation is **voluntary** at each level
- Parental notification is **required**
- Designed to be completed in **one class period**
- Completely **anonymous**



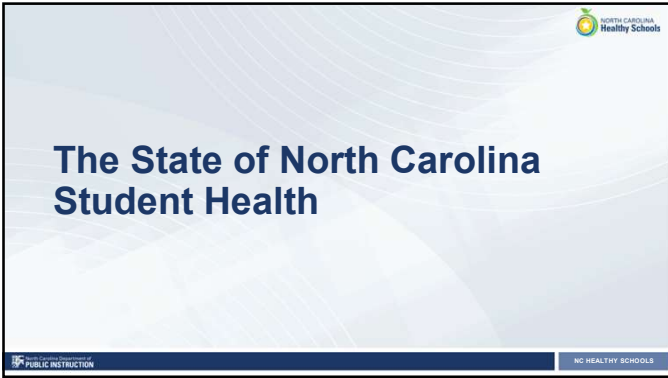
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Priority Health-Risk Behaviors and Health Outcomes Monitored by YRBS

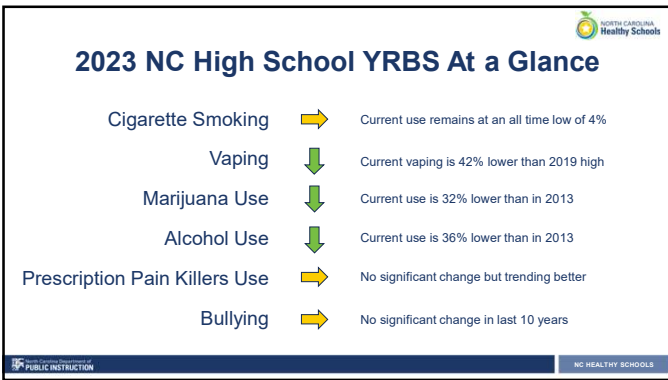
- Behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of mortality and morbidity
 - Unintentional injuries and violence
 - Sexual behaviors
 - Alcohol and other drug use
 - Tobacco use
 - Unhealthy dietary behaviors
 - Inadequate physical activity
- Obesity
- Other priority health issues
