New Commissioner - Spencer Merriweather

Spencer Merriweather is district attorney for Mecklenburg County. He was appointed in 2017 by and elected to full terms in 2018 and 2022.



Merriweather previously served as an assistant district attorney prosecuting cases ranging from sexual assault and domestic violence to drug trafficking and homicides. Since taking office, he has emphasized victimcentered responses to domestic, sexual and child violence. He has also expanded access to restorative justice programs and served as a champion for The Umbrella Center.

Merriweather earned his law degree from the UNC-Chapel Hill and his undergraduate degree from Princeton University. He serves as chair for the Association of Prosecuting Attorneys, vice president of the National District Attorneys Association and an executive committee member of the NC Conference of District Attorneys. He's an active member of the National Association of Black Prosecutors and a past president of the Mecklenburg Bar Foundation.

sworn deputy sheriff with the Guilford County
Sheriff's Office. During his career, he worked
as a detention officer, patrol officer,
detective, detective sergeant, lieutenant and

the sheriff's office, he was employed as a
court security officer for the U.S. Marshals
Service. From 2019 until 2025, he was a
licensed private investigator. Byrd is married
