Bladen County Violence Profile



Bladen County, in southeastern North Carolina, has a population of 29,670 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Elizabethtown (pop.3,265). The closest trauma centers are Womack Army & Novant NHRMC (both 50 miles from Elizabethtown).

Violent Deaths

Bladen County had 8 violent deaths* in 2022

83% of homicides and 63% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm



In Bladen County, 39% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict

Crime

In 2023, Bladen County had a total crime count of 1,490 with 75 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Bladen County has decreased by 5% in the past year



The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (62.7%) and rape (13.3%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. Bladen County had a reporting coverage of 94% of the population compared to the statewide coverage of 98% (2021).
