

Caldwell County Violence Profile




Caldwell County, located in northwest North Carolina, has a population of 81,028 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Lenoir with a population of 18,162. The closest trauma center is Atrium Health Cleveland (49 miles from Lenoir).

Violent Deaths

Caldwell County had 31 violent deaths* in 2022

67% of homicides and 66% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Crime

In 2023, Caldwell County had a total crime count of 4,053 with 102 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Caldwell County has decreased by 5% in the past year

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (76.5%) and rape (12.8%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. 

Violent Death Rate by Demographics; Caldwell County, 2013-2022


