Camden County, located in northeastern North Carolina, has a population of 11,231 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Camden with a population of 1,050. The closest trauma center is ECU Medical Center (96 miles from Camden).

Camden County had 3 violent deaths* in 2022

50% of homicides and 54% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Crime

In 2023, Camden County had a total crime count of 497 with 11 violent crimes*

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (81.8%) and murder & non-negligent manslaughter (9.1%)
