

Carteret County Violence Profile



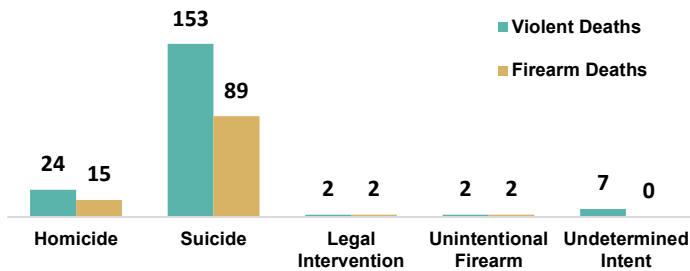
Carteret County, in southeastern North Carolina, has a population of 70,193 and is predominantly urban. The largest city is Morehead City (pop. 10,053). The closest trauma center is Naval Medical Center Camp Lejeune (44 miles from Morehead City).

Violent Deaths

Carteret County had 18 violent deaths* in 2022

63% of homicides and 58% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Crime

In 2023, Carteret County had a total crime count of 3,534 with 118 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Carteret County has decreased by 11% in the past year

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (67.0%) and rape (17.8%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. In Carteret County, 52% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict

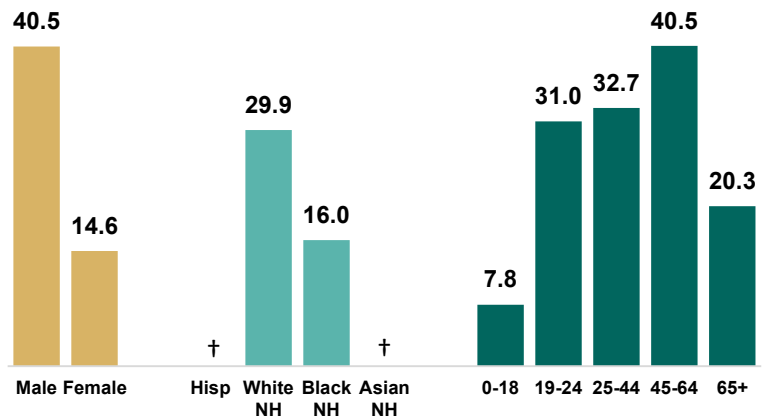

Violent Death Rate by Demographics; Carteret County, 2013-2022

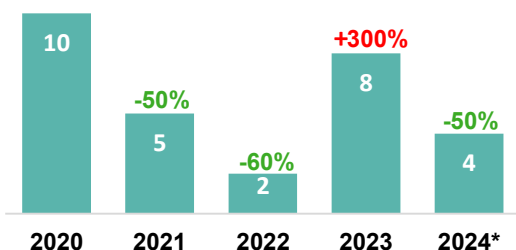
