

Craven County Violence Profile



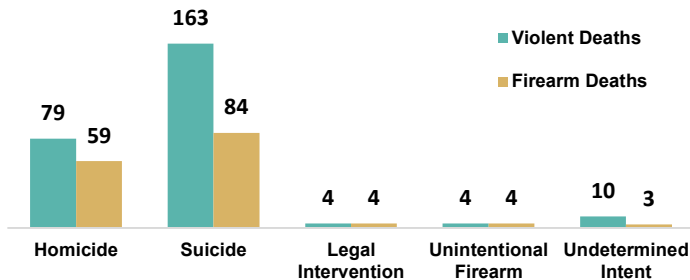
Craven County, located in eastern North Carolina, has a population of 104,999 and is predominantly urban. The largest city is New Bern with a population of 32,854. The closest trauma center is Naval Medical Center Camp Lejeune (45 miles from New Bern).

Violent Deaths

Craven County had 31 violent deaths* in 2022

75% of homicides and 52% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Crime

In 2023, Craven County had a total crime count of 6,053 with 213 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Craven County has decreased by 15% in the past year

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (81.7%) and rape (8.5%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. In Craven County, 51% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict

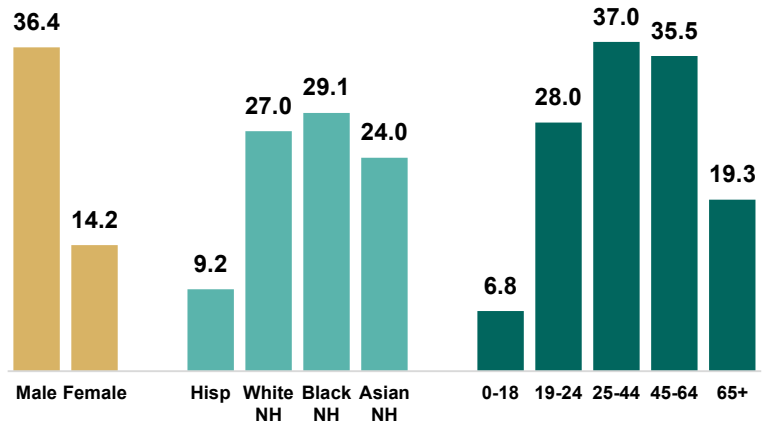

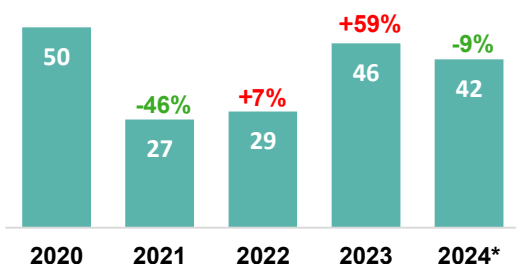
Violent Death Rate by Demographics; Craven County, 2013-2022
