

# Dare County Violence Profile



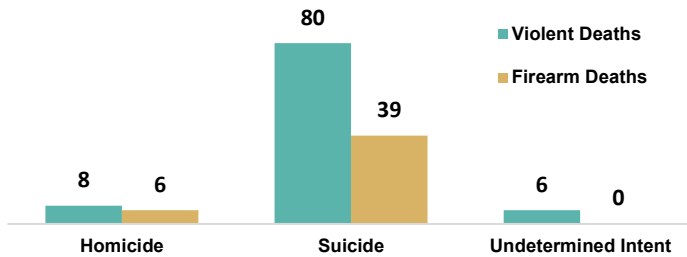
Dare County, located in northeastern North Carolina, has a population of 38,356 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Kill Devil Hills with a population of 7,854. The closest trauma center is ECU Medical Center (128 miles from Kill Devil Hills).

## Violent Deaths

Dare County had 16 violent deaths\* in 2022

**75% of homicides and 49% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm**

## Crime

In 2023, Dare County had a total crime count of 2,555 with 99 violent crimes\*

**Violent crime in Dare County has increased by 120% in the past year**

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (84.9%) and rape (6.1%)

\*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. In Dare County, 88% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict

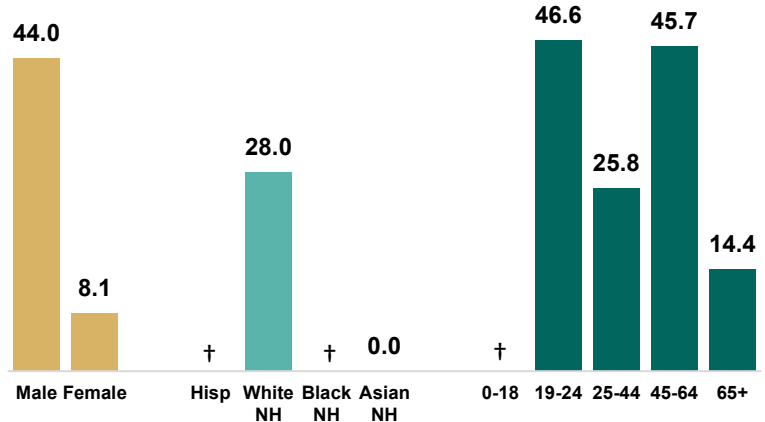

Violent Death Rate by Demographics; Dare County, 2013-2022

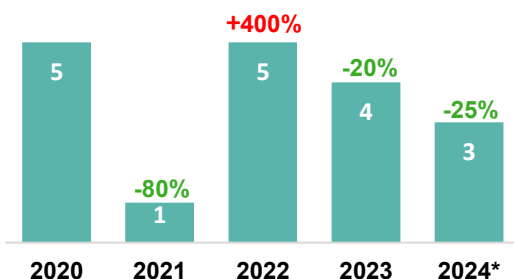
