Forsyth County, located in central North Carolina, has a population of 399,441 and is predominantly urban. The largest city is Winston-Salem with a population of 255,089. The closest trauma center is Atrium WFBH (in Winston-Salem).

Forsyth County had 98 violent deaths* in 2022

78% of homicides and 56% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Crime

In 2023, Forsyth County had a total crime count of 33,820 with 1,842 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Forsyth County has decreased by 16% in the past year



The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (76.6%) and robbery (14.4%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery.
