Haywood County Violence Profile



Haywood County, located in western North Carolina, has a population of 63,677 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Waynesville with a population of 10,949. The closest trauma center is Mission Hospitals (32 miles from Waynesville).

Violent Deaths

Haywood County had 16 violent deaths* in 2022

62% of homicides and 63% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm



In Haywood County, 53% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict





Crime

In 2023, Haywood County had a total crime count of 3,740 with 158 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Haywood County has increased by 26% in the past year



The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (73.4%) and rape (17.1%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery.
