Henderson County Violence Profile




Henderson County, in southwestern North Carolina, has a population of 121,094 and is predominantly urban. The largest city is Hendersonville with a population of 15,654. The closest trauma center is Mission Hospitals (20 miles from Hendersonville).



In 2023, Henderson County had a total crime count of 4,467 with 148 violent crimes*


Violent crime in Henderson County has increased by 4% in the past year



The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (68.2%) and rape (17.6%)


