

Hoke County Violence Profile




Hoke County, in southern North Carolina, has a population of 55,956 and is predominantly urban. The largest city is Raeford (pop. 4,532). The closest trauma center is Womack Army and Cape Fear Valley Medical Centers (both 20 miles from Raeford).

Violent Deaths

Hoke County had 25 violent deaths* in 2022

82% of homicides and 67% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Crime

In 2023, Hoke County had a total crime count of 2,249 with 240 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Hoke County has decreased by 10% in the past year

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (90.8%) and sexual assault with an object (3.3%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. In Hoke County, 40% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict


Homicide circumstances vary by sex of the victim

Violent Death Rate by Demographics; Hoke County, 2013-2022


