Jackson County, located in western North Carolina, has a population of 45,878 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Cullowhee with a population of 6,837. The closest trauma center is Mission Hospitals (53 miles from Cullowhee).

Crime

In 2023, Jackson County had a total crime count of 1,933 with 93 violent crimes*

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (71.0%) and rape (22.6%)
