## **Macon County Violence Profile**




Macon County, located in southwestern North Carolina, has a population of 39,298 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Franklin with a population of 4,424. The closest trauma center is Mission Hospitals (67 miles from Franklin).

Macon County had 9 violent deaths\* in 2022

79% of homicides and 69% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

In 2023, Macon County had a total crime count of 1,197 with 39 violent crimes\*


The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (59.0%) and rape (25.6%)

Male, Non-Hispanic White, and older adult residents have the highest rates of violent death in Macon County


In Macon County, 42% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict **Homicide circumstances vary by** sex of the victim
