Martin County Violence Profile





Martin County had 7 violent deaths* in 2022


68% of homicides and 72% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

Violent crime in Martin County has decreased by 15% in the past year




The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (69.9%) and rape (17.2%)


Male, Non-Hispanic White, and young adult residents have the highest rates of violent death in Martin County
