

# McDowell County Violence Profile



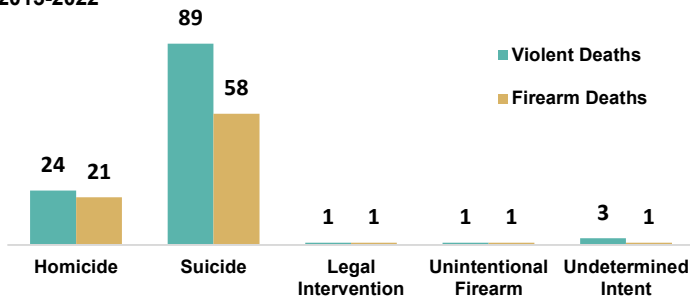
McDowell County, located in western North Carolina, has a population of 45,169 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Marion with a population of 7,373. The closest trauma center is Mission Hospitals (36 miles from Marion).

## Violent Deaths

McDowell County had 10 violent deaths\* in 2022

**88% of homicides and 65% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm**

## Crime

In 2023, McDowell County had a total crime count of 2,183 with 59 violent crimes\*

**Violent crime in McDowell County has decreased by 27% in the past year**

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (76.3%) and rape (11.9%)

\*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. 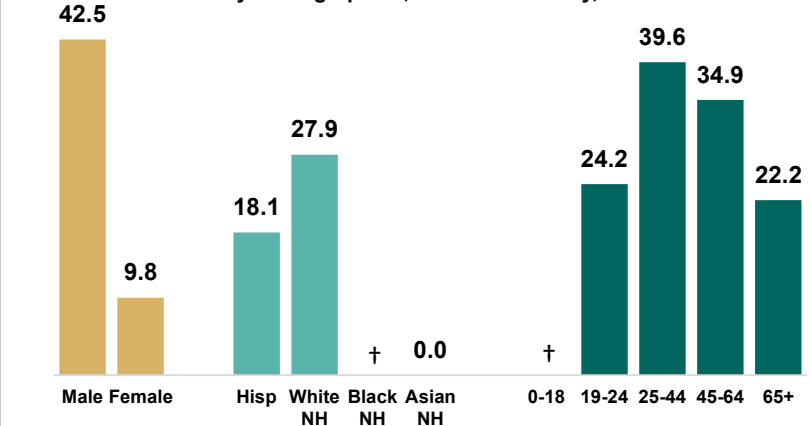

Violent Death Rate by Demographics; McDowell County, 2013-2022

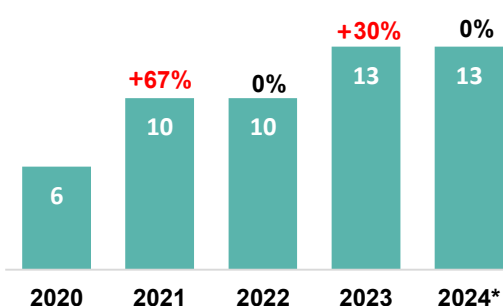
