Northampton County Violence Profile



Northampton County, located in northeastern North Carolina, has a population of 16,491 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Gaston with a population of 948. The closest trauma center is ECU Medical Center (86 miles from Gaston).

Violent Deaths

Northampton County had 3 violent deaths* in 2022

84% of homicides and 76% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm



In Northampton County, 35% of homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict

Crime

In 2023, Northampton County had a total crime count of 994 with 92 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Northampton County has increased by 64% in the past year



The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (70.7%) and robbery (17.4%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery.
