

Pasquotank County Violence Profile



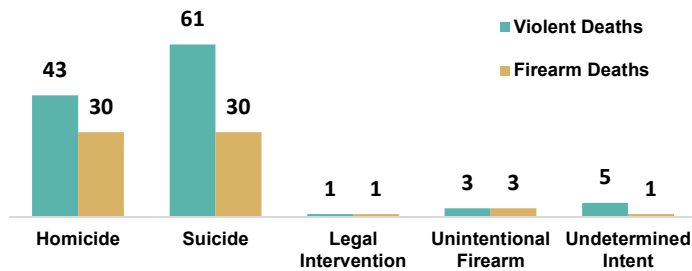
Pasquotank County, located in eastern North Carolina, has a population of 41,996 and is predominantly urban. The largest city is Elizabeth City with a population of 19,177. The closest trauma center is ECU Medical Center (90 miles from Elizabeth City).

Violent Deaths

Pasquotank County had 8 violent deaths* in 2022

70% of homicides and 49% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

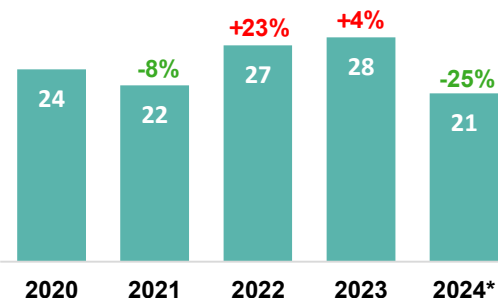

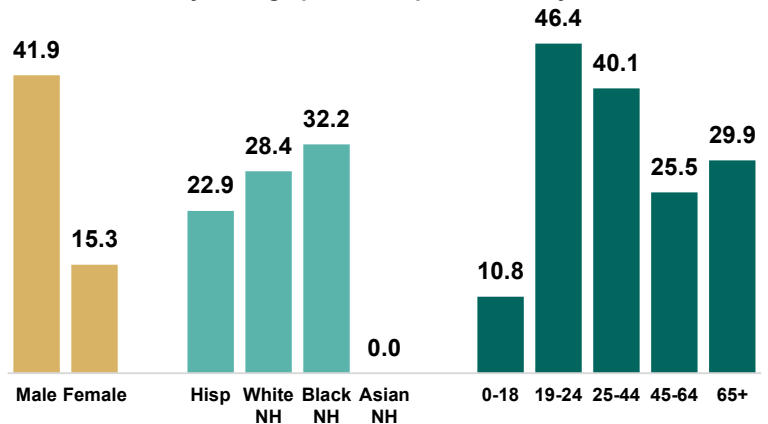

Crime

In 2023, Pasquotank County had a total crime count of 2,207 with 128 violent crimes*

Violent crime in Pasquotank County has decreased by 4% in the past year

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (71.1%) and robbery (12.5%)

*Violent Crimes include the offenses of homicide (murder and non-negligent manslaughter and negligent manslaughter), aggravated assault, rape (including sodomy and sexual assault with an object) and robbery. In 2024, a total of 21 Pasquotank County residents visited the emergency department due to firearm injury
