
Robeson County Violence Profile



Robeson County, in south-central North Carolina, has a population of 119,163 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Lumberton with a population of 19,051. The closest trauma center is Cape Fear Valley Medical Center (32 miles from Lumberton).

Violent Deaths

Robeson County had 51 violent deaths* in 2022 85% of homicides and 63% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

In 2023, Robeson County had a total crime count of 10,506 with 1008 violent crimes*

The most common violent crimes were aggravated assault (77.1%) and robbery (14.0%)

Male, Non-Hispanic Black, and young adult residents have the highest rates of violent death in Robeson County


In Robeson County, 46% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict Homicide circumstances vary by sex of the victim
