

Stanly County Violence Profile



Stanly County, located in central North Carolina, has a population of 68,635 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Albemarle with a population of 17,307. The closest trauma center is Atrium Health Cabarrus (26 miles from Albemarle).

Stanly County only reports crime data that represents 79% of the county population. Due to low reporting, crime statistics are not interpretable.


Male, Non-Hispanic White, and middle-aged adult residents have the highest rates of violent death in Stanly County

Stanly County had 25 violent deaths* in 2022

In Stanly County, 34% of all homicide deaths involved an argument or conflict



Violent Death Rate by Demographics; Stanly County, 2013-2022


