

Warren County Violence Profile



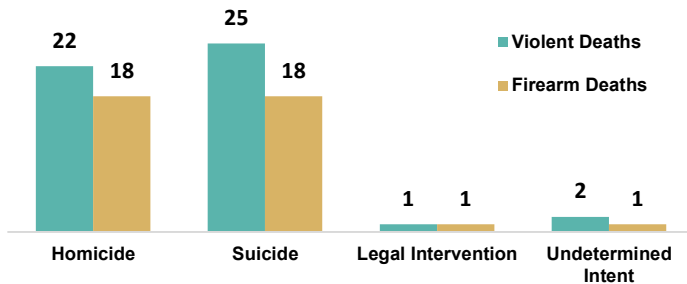
Warren County, located in northern North Carolina, has a population of 19,154 and is predominantly rural. The largest city is Norlina with a population of 922. The closest trauma center is Duke University Hospital (56 miles from Norlina).

Violent Deaths

Warren County had 5 violent deaths* in 2022

82% of homicides and 72% of suicides in the past 10 years involved a firearm

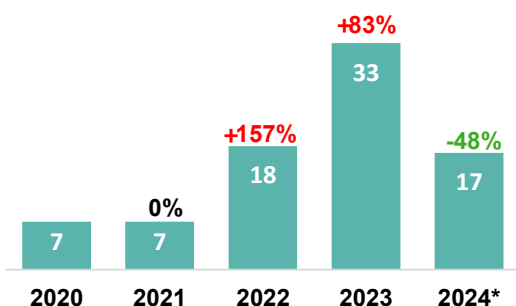

In 2023, Warren County had a total crime count of 777 with 68 violent crimes*

Violent Crimes per 100,000 people

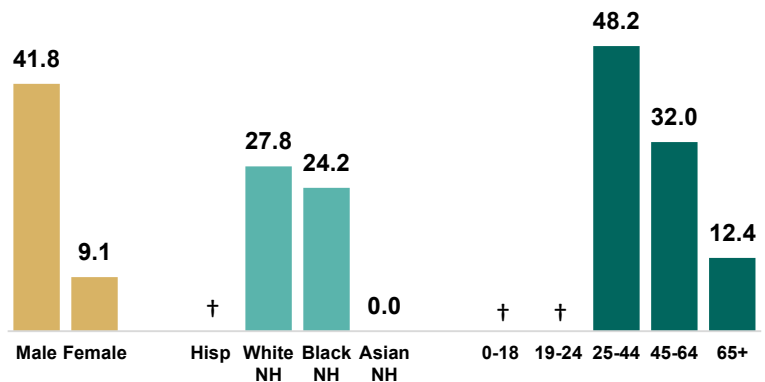
