Complaints Received and Delinquency Rate 2010-2020







Juvenile Justice 2020 Statistical Snapshot


Juvenile Intake

Juveniles can receive multiple outcomes (e.g., a complaint that was originally diverted, could later result in being approved for court). In 2020, these scenarios led to a juvenile count for the "APPROVED FOR COURT," "DIVERTED" and "CLOSED" classifications to total 10,800 youth, with 30,185 filed complaints.

2020 Community-based programs offered successful alternatives to commitment for high-risk youth. JCPC programs served **17,997** youth last year.
