

### **Providing Essential Training**

Year two of the COVID-19 pandemic saw some classes return to in-person learning, as conditions allowed, but many classes remained online. Overall, the number of students participating in classes increased about 15% over 2020 levels.

# CERT Training and Response



- Four new CERT programs were added in 2021 in Buncombe, Swain and Robeson (2) counties.
- 172 students completed CERT training courses.
- Numerous activations to support COVID vaccine clinics and call centers.
- Cary CERT assisted Cary Fire with smoke detector distribution and Chatham CERT tracked gas availability for Chatham EM during Colonial Pipeline outage.
- Many local monthly meetings on Zoom.
- Ten CERT members or teams recognized with awards.










# **State Emergency Response Commission**





The State Emergency Response Commission meets quarterly to review, assess, plan and implement projects and procedures to protect North Carolina residents. July meeting was held in-person. Other meetings were online via WebEx and streamed on the DPS website for public viewing.









Avery, Mitchell and Yancey counties were certified as StormReady by the National Weather Service in 2021. That brings the total of Storm Ready counties to 94.

NCEM and NWS are working to encourage all counties to be certified StormReady by:

- Establishing a warning point & EOC
- Having multiple ways to get weather warnings
- Creating a system to monitor local weather
- Promoting emergency preparedness
- Developing a hazardous weather plan
