Although not currently a funding participant, the NCDOT has expressed support for the project and has agreed to act as a design and construction partner. The proposed improvements will require a right-of-way encroachment agreement from the NCDOT. This multi-agency funding and support structure strengthens the project and will allow the Town to pursue the work as an integrated resiliency improvement.
