FINAL AGENCY DECISIONS

David Logan Marsh - 20 DOJ 03786. Mr. Marsh was not present. This case was heard by Administrative Law Stacey Bice Bawtinhimer on October 15, 2021. This case involved the summary suspension order of Petitioner's unarmed guard registration based on a lack of good moral character and temperate habits as evidenced by charges of 1) statutory rape of a person who is 15 years of age or younger; 2) statutory sexual offense with a person who is 15 years or younger; 3) sexual activity by a substitute parent or custodian (2 counts); and 4) taking indecent liberties with children (2 counts) in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina.

Vice Chairman Steve Johnson presented the Laws and Rules Committee Report. Vice-Chairman Steve Johnson, Debra Duncan, Kim Heffney, Jerry Pitman and Tamara Rabenold met on December 15, 2021, from 2:00 P.M. to 2:53 P.M. The committee reviewed and discussed the following rules: 14B NCAC 16 .0404, .0201, .0904, .0911, .1306 and .1406. He also gave an update on the Board's pending bill SB 424.

VICE CHAIRMAN STEVE JOHNSON MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE RULES AMENDMENTS. ASSATA BUFFALOE SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED. NONE OPPOSED.

DEBRA DUNCAN MADE A MOTIONED TO ACCEPT THE LAWS AND RULES REPORT. SAM RUSSELL SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED. NONE OPPOSED.

VICE CHAIRMAN STEVE JOHNSON PRESENTED THE TRAINING AND EDUCATION REPORT.

On December 15, 2021, the Training and Education Committee met from 1:00 P.M. to 1:45 P.M. Vice-Chairman Steve Johnson, Stacy Buff, Tamara Rabenold, and Sam Russell were present. Training Investigator Ray Bullard presented the Trainer courses delivered in 2021 and the course schedule for 2022. Investigator Bullard's report included information from two reported accidental weapon discharges. The Committee reviewed six (6) applications for continuing education credits, and they were not approved due to insufficient information. The committee

recommended that the Board extend the covid-19 emergency rules for certifications and licensees' holder due to lack of available trainers/instructors.

VICE-CHAIRMAN STEVE JOHNSON MADE A MOTIONED TO EXTEND THE COVID-19 EMERGENCY RULES FOR A PERIOD OF NINETY DAYS. NADA LAWRIMORE SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED. NONE OPPOSED.

Training Investigator Ray Bullard reported that the committee recommended the Board to include terminology for Firearms Trainer failure on recertification in the Firearms Trainer Manual. The Firearms Trainer terminology failure on recertification is listed below:

Handgun- Must recertify every two (2) years twice in three attempts.

• If an individual fails to recertify with either a revolver or semiautomatic they may return at a later date to recertify with the weapon they failed with. They **must** qualify with one of the two weapons.

• If an individual holds only one handgun certification and fails to recertify they may return at a later date and attempt to recertify *if* their Firearms Trainer Certification has not expired. If the Firearms Trainer Certification expires, they must repeat the entire course.

Long Gun- Must recertify every two (2) years, once in two attempts.

• If an individual fails to recertify with either the rifle or shotgun they may return at a later date and have one attempt to recertify with the failed weapon. They must qualify with one of the two weapons.

Note: The instructor may not teach on any weapon system they fail to recertify on until such time they meet the recertification requirements.

VICE CHAIRMAN STEVE JOHNSON MADE A MOTION TO ACCEPT THE ABOVE TERMINOLOGY FOR FIREARMS TRAINER FAILURE ON RECERTIFICATION. DAVID STEPHENS SECONDED THE MOTION. MOTION CARRIED. NONE OPPOSED.

Mr. Johnson stated that the committee had a request for the unguard training manual to be available on the web in electronic format for both students and instructors to have access to download. A printed hard copy will still be made available at the Justice Academy upon request.

Terminology for Firearms Trainer failure on Recertification

Handgun- Must recertify every two (2) years twice in three attempts.

- If an individual fails to recertify with either a revolver or semiautomatic they may return at a later date to recertify with the weapon they failed with. They **must** have at least qualified with one of the two weapons.
- If an individual holds only one handgun certification and fails to recertify they may return at a later date and attempt to recertify *if* their Firearms Trainer Certification has not expired. If the Firearms Trainer Certification expires, they must repeat the entire course.

Long Gun- Must recertify every two (2) years, once in two attempts.

• If an individual fails to recertify with either the rifle or shotgun they may return at a later date and have one attempt to recertify with the failed weapon. They must have at least qualified with one of the two weapons.

<u>NOTE</u>: The instructor may not teach on any weapon system they fail to recertify on until such time they meet the recertification requirements.

Weapon Discharges:

• On Monday, October 4, 2021, Robert Rhodes, trainer for Allied Universal, emailed Investigator Bullard and advised of a weapon discharge at the Bladen County Hospital and that the Elizabethtown Police Department had been called to investigate.

On Friday, October 8, 2021 Rhodes forwarded a copy of an Elizabethtown Police Department Incident Report to Investigator Bullard. The report indicates that Elizabethtown Police Department was called to report a weapon discharge at the Bladen County Hospital on October 5, 2021 by Bob Stacy the Head of Security. According to the report Nimi Delonte Peterson was working an armed post at the Bladen County

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Hospital in Elizabethtown, North Carolina. On Monday, October 4, 2021 at approximately 4:00 pm, during shift change, Peterson was attempting to clear his weapon to be placed in the lock box of the Security Office. Peterson negligently pulled the trigger of his handgun. The weapon discharged one round striking a portable radio in a charging station. The projectile did not exit the radio.

According to Rhodes, Peterson was carrying a Glock, Model 22, .40 Caliber handgun. Investigator Bullard queried PPSM(Permitium) and discovered that Peterson was a properly registered Armed Guard for Allied Universal and was qualified to carry a Glock, Model 22, .40 caliber handgun. A copy of the email and police report are included in this case file.

• On November 22, 2021, Steven Thomas, Firearms Trainer for P&G Security, emailed Investigator Bullard and advised of a negligent weapon discharge. The email advised that on November 21, 2021 at approximately 12:45 p.m. security guard Corey Williams was returning to his post in Tower #1 at the Southern Correctional Institution located in Troy, North Carolina. Williams retrieved his issued Springfield, Model XD, 9mm handgun, placed a loaded magazine into the weapon and pressed the slide release with his finger on the trigger. The weapon fired one round into floor of the tower. Williams was immediately removed from post. Thomas advised that the Department of Corrections is investigating the incident.

Investigator Bullard queried PPSM(Permitium) and discovered that Williams is a properly registered armed guard for P&G Security. Williams was qualified to carry a Springfield, Model XD, 9mm handgun. According to Thomas, Williams has been terminated from P&G Security. At the time of this report Williams' Armed Registration is still valid. Investigator Bullard has attempted to contact the Department of Corrections and determine the outcome of their investigation without success. A copy of the email and a statement from Williams is included in this case file.

PERSONNEL

Private Protective Services currently has four vacant positions:

- Registration Application Processor (two positions) Recruitment in progress
- PPSB Secretary Recruitment in progress
- Administrative Assistant Staffed with a part-time, temporary employee

Private Protective Services on Nov. 8, 2021, hired Daniel "Danny" Cheatham for the investigator position based in Hickory, N.C. Danny is originally from Scranton, PA, and worked with the Clermont (Florida) Police Department from 1989 to 2001. He served in numerous roles within CPD, to include patrol officer, detective, detective sergeant, and lieutenant. Danny was recognized as CPD's *Officer of the Year* in 1992 and 1993 and received an award for actions "Above and Beyond the Call of Duty" in 1996. Danny later moved to Hickory, N.C., obtained his private investigator license in 2003, and opened D.C. Investigations. 



I. CONSENT AGREEMENT, SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS & CIVIL PENALTIES

- 1. On October 21, 2021 Felicia Sheares/Admiral Security Services, entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board in the amount of \$7,711.20 for registration violations. The Consent Agreement was signed by QA Felicia Sheares on November 15, 2021. Paid in full.
- On October 21, 2021 Christal Neptune /Neptune Worldwide Protection, Inc., entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board in the amount of \$612.00 for registration violations. The temporary agreement was signed by QA Christal Neptune on October 5, 2021. Payment has not been received. (Note: The Consent Agreement was mailed on November 5, 2021 and returned to PPS on November 23, 2021 marked "Not Deliverable as Addressed-Unable to Forward". Ms. Graham spoke with Ms. Neptune on December 6, 2021 and e-mailed her the letter and Consent Agreement.)

II. OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

III. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

a. At its April 2020 meeting the Board adopted amendments to five administrative rules to help lessen the burden on applicants, licensees and trainer certification holders during the lock-downs and travel bans enacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The amendment to 14B NCAC 16.0201(e), .0806 (e), .0904(e), .1202(d), and .1203 first became emergency rules, and are now temporary rules. (Note: In .1203 the Board did not add language but merely removed the last line of (g) which limited online courses to six hours and moved (h) to make it "(e)" in .1202.) Unless the Board took action for each change to become a permanent rule to be in effect for any future declared national or state of emergency, these rule amendments expired on April 30, 2021. A copy of each rule, as amended, was attached to my April 22, 2021 Attorney's Report. The Board voted to make these rules permanent.

The Notice of Text was filed and a Public Hearing set for Tuesday, June 22, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board office. The Public Comment Period was to end August 2, 2021, however, it was discovered prior to the Public Hearing date that the notice of the Public Hearing had not been posted on the Board's website as required so a new Public Hearing date has been posted; it was Tuesday, August 17, 2021 at 2:00

p.m. at the Board's office. The new Public Comment Period ended October 1, 2021. There were no comments, oral or written.

The Board voted to approve these amendments at its October 21, 2016 meeting. The Submission for Permanent Rule form for these rules was filed on October 27, 2021, responses to Request for Technical Changes were filed November 22, 2021, and they will be considered by the Rules Review Commission at its December 16, 2021 meeting.

b. At its June 2021 meeting the Law & Rules Committee reviewed and discussed 11 proposed administrative rule amendments and adoptions and proposed to the full Board proceeding with amendments to five administrative rules (i.e. 14B NCAC 16 .0110, .0501, .0807, .0903 & .1203.) I was requested to make changes to one other rule and a proposed new rule and return these to the Law & Rules Committee for consideration at its August 2021 meeting. (Note: The status of the amendments to 14B NCAC 16 .0103 and new 14B NCAC 16 .0115 are addressed in c., below.)

The Notice of Text for the first five rules was filed on July 23, 2021. The Public Hearing was held August 31, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board's office and there were no attendees; the Public Comment Period ended October 20, 2021. There were no comments, oral or written.

The Board voted to approve these rule amendments at its October 21, 2021 meeting. The Submission for Permanent Rule form for these rules was filed on December 9, 2021.

c. The above referenced administrative rule amendment and adoption were considered by the Law & Rules Committee at its August meeting and were recommended to the Board for approval. The Board adopted the Committee's recommendation.

The Notice of Text for the amendment to 14B NCAC 16 .0103 and the adoption of new 14B NCAC 16 .0115 was filed on August 24, 2021. The Public Hearing was held October 5, 2021. The Public Comment Period expired November 15, 2021. There were no comments, oral or written. A copy of these rules is attached as Attachment 2.

A vote to approve these rule amendments is in order for today.

CHAPTER 16 - PRIVATE PROTECTIVE SERVICES BOARD

SECTION .0100 - ORGANIZATION AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

14B NCAC 16.0103 DEFINITIONS

In addition to the definitions set forth in G.S. 74C, the following definitions shall apply throughout this Subchapter:

- "Agency Head" means the Chairman of the Board. (1)
- "Applicant" means any person, firm, or corporation applying to the Board for a license, trainee permit, registration, or (2)firearms trainer certificate.
- "Armed Private Security Officer" means an individual employed, full time or part time, by a contract security company (3)or a proprietary security organization:
 - who at any time wears, carries, or possesses a firearm in the performance of his or her duties; and (a)
 - (b) whose principal duty is that of:
 - an armed security guard, officer, patrol, or watchman; (i)
 - (ii)an armed armored car service guard;
 - (iii) a private detective; or
 - (iv) an armed courier service guard.
- "Board" means the Private Protective Services Board established by G.S. 74C. (4)
- "Branch Manager or Operator" means the individual endowed with the responsibility and liability for a branch office. (5) "Branch Office" means a separate but dependent part of a central organization engaged in the business of providing (6) private protective services established for the purpose of extending the activities of the central organization. The establishment of a telephone number or mailing address in the company name constitutes prima facie evidence of a branch office. If an out-of-state person, firm, association, or corporation opens an office in North Carolina, the North Carolina office shall be deemed the principal place of business and shall have a resident licensed qualifying agent.

- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Private Protective Services Board. (7)
- "Contract Security Company" means any person, firm, association, or corporation engaging in a private protective (8) services business as defined in G.S. 74C-3 that provides the services on a contractual basis for a fee or other valuable consideration to any other person, firm, association, or corporation.
- "Direct Supervision" means personal, face-to-face contact and direction of the trainee's activities on a frequent and (9) reasonable basis.
- "Investigative Capacity" means any law enforcement agency position for which the duties include conducting (10)investigations and interviews, completing reports, and testifying in courts, administrative hearings, or military tribunals.
- "Law Enforcement Officer" means a sworn peace officer who has the power of arrest, and who is an employee of the (11)United States, any state, or any political subdivision of a state.
- "Licensee" means any person licensed to perform private protective services in North Carolina in accordance with (12)G.S. 74C.
- "Proprietary Security Organization" means any person, firm, association, corporation, or department thereof: (13)(a)
 - that employs any of the following:
 - (i) watchmen;
 - (ii) security guards or officers;
 - (iii) patrol personnel;
 - (iv) armored car personnel; or
 - (v) couriers; and
 - that employs these persons regularly and exclusively as an employee in connection with the business affairs (b) of such employer.
- "Qualifying Agent" means the individual licensee who is responsible for the private protective services business. If (14)the licensee maintains an office in North Carolina the Qualifying Agent must be a resident of North Carolina.
- "Registered agent" means the individual resident of North Carolina designated by the business entity in lieu of the <u>(15)</u> Qualifying Agent as allowed by G.S. 74C-8(c)(1) who may be, but is not required to be the registered agent required by G.S. 55D-30.
- (15)(16) "Restored" means that an individual is no longer in need of psychiatric care as determined by a physician.
- (16)(17) "Temporary unarmed security guard" means an individual who is hired for a period of 30 days or less within a calendar year and who is designated by his or her employer as a temporary security guard at the start of employment.

14B NCAC 16.0115 **COMPLAINTS**

(a) Any person may file a complaint against any licensee, trainee, registrant or certificate holder, or any unlicensed or unregistered person, for any violation of G.S. 74C or 14B NCAC 16, or any violation of State or federal criminal law. A complaint form is available on the Board's website at www.ncdps.gov/dps-services/complaint/private-protective-services-board or a copy may be requested from the Board's office.

(b) The complaint must set forth all relevant facts and the basis for the complainant's belief that the licensee, trainee, registrant or certificate holder is in violation. The complainant must be willing to be interviewed by the Board's investigator, provide any information or documentation to support the allegation, and appear and testify if necessary, before the Screening Committee or at any hearing. Anonymous complaints may be accepted at the discretion of the Director.

(c) The complaint must be filed with the Board on-line, via e-mail, by U.S. Mail or by hand-delivery to the Board's office.

(d) The complaint shall be evaluated by the Director or the Director's designee and if valid will be assigned to an investigator for further substantiation. The results of the investigation shall be reported to the Board's Grievance Committee for review and action.

(e) The Director retains the right to close a case if at any point in the process it is determined there is no actionable violation.

(f) The Director shall notify the complainant and the licensee, trainee, registrant, or certificate holder of the initial complaint and its final disposition.

ISSUE

Whether the summary suspension of Petitioner's unarmed guard registration should be upheld.

APPLICABLE STATUTES AND RULES

Official notice is taken of the following statutes and rules applicable to this case: N.C.G.S. § 74C-12(a)(25); 14B NCAC 16 .0106(a).

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Board is established pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §74C-1, *et seq.*, and is charged with the duty of licensing and registering individuals engaged in the armed and unarmed security guard and patrol business.
- 2. Petitioner holds an unarmed guard registration.
- 3. Petitioner was charged in Mecklenburg County, State of North Carolina, on September 8, 2021 with: 1) statutory rape of a person who is 15 years of age or

younger in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.25; 2) statutory sexual offense with a person who is 15 years of age or younger in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.30; 3) sexual activity by a substitute parent or custodian (2 counts) in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.31; and 4) taking indecent liberties with children (2 counts) in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-202.1.

- 4. Paul Sherwin, Director of Respondent Board, learned of Petitioner's criminal charges from media reports, and following further investigation Mr. Sherwin determined that the charges, if supported by the evidence, constitute a threat to the public health, safety and welfare and summarily suspended Petitioner's registration by Order dated September 16, 2021.
- 5. Neither Petitioner, nor Petitioner's employer, G4S, reported the above-referenced criminal charges to Respondent Board.
- 6. Petitioner is entitled to a hearing on Respondent's suspension of his registration.
- 7. By Notice of Hearing dated September 20, 2021, and mailed via certified mail, Respondent advised Petitioner that a hearing on the summary suspension of his unarmed guard registration would be held at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 1711 New Hope Church Road, Raleigh, North Carolina 27609 on October 25, 2021. Petitioner receipted for the certified mail on September 23, 2021 but did not appear at the hearing.
- 8. Mr. Sherwin testified that he determined Petitioner is currently being held in the Mecklenburg County Detention Center.
- 9. Petitioner's Order of Summary Suspension and Notice of Hearing were admitted into evidence as Respondent's Exhibit 2 and Exhibit 3.
- 10. The Warrants for Arrest for Petitioner's six criminal charges above were admitted into evidence as Respondent's Exhibit 1. The charges were sought and obtained by a Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Officer.
- 11. As of the date of the hearing of this contested case, Petitioner's criminal charges have not been adjudicated and remain pending.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The parties properly are before the Office of Administrative Hearings. All parties received notice of this hearing in conformance with G.S. § 150B-38.
- 2. Under G.S. §74C-12(a)(25), Respondent Board may deny or suspend a registration if it determined that the applicant has demonstrated intemperate habits or lacks good moral character.

- 3. Respondent Board presented evidence that Petitioner had been charged with criminal violations in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina that, by their very nature, constitute a threat to the public health, safety and welfare.
- 4. Petitioner's charges have yet to be adjudicated and Petitioner failed to appear and present evidence to explain why these charges are not considered a threat to the public health, safety and welfare.
- 5. It is not the function of the Tribunal to determine Petitioner's guilt or innocence of the criminal charges at issue. Rather, the Tribunal simply determines whether Respondent Board acted in conformance with its own administrative rules and otherwise in compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable law or rule.
- 6. The Tribunal has no difficulty determining, given the nature of the charges and the evidence presented at the hearing, that Respondent Board acted lawfully and properly in its action of summary suspension.

Based on the foregoing, the undersigned makes the following:

PROPOSED FINAL DECISION

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the undersigned hereby recommends that the summary suspension of unarmed guard registration be UPHELD.

NOTICE AND ORDER

The North Carolina Private Protective Services Board will make the Final Agency Decision in this contested case. As the Final Decision maker, that agency is required to give each party an opportunity to file exceptions to this proposal for decision, to submit proposed findings of fact, and to present oral and written arguments to the agency pursuant to N.C. THIS ORDER, issued pursuant to authority granted by North Carolina General Statute § 150B-3(c) and North Carolina General Statute § 74C-6, summarily suspends the Unarmed Guard Registration issued to David Logan Marsh of Waxhaw, North Carolina. In support thereof, the Private Protective Services Board's Director finds the following:

STATEMENT OF LAW AND FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The North Carolina Private Protective Services Board is an agency of the State of North Carolina and is created pursuant to the North Carolina Private Protective Services Act, N.C.G.S. § 74C-1 *et seq*.

2. The position of Director of the North Carolina Private Protective Services Board is created pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 74C-6.

3. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 74C-12(a)(25), the Board may, after compliance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, deny, suspend or revoke a license or registration issued under this Chapter if it is determined that the registrant demonstrated intemperate habits or a lack of good moral character.

4. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 74C-6, the Director shall administer the directives contained in the Private Protective Services Act and the rules promulgated by the Board in order to actively police the industry.

5. David Logan Marsh is registered as an unarmed guard with G4S, a licensed Security Guard and Patrol business located at 1 Centerview Drive, Suite 105, Greensboro, NC. Mr. Marsh's registration has an expiration date of May 31, 2022.

6. Investigation has revealed that Mr. Marsh was charged in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina with:

a. Statutory rape of a person who is 15 years of age or younger in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.25;

b. Statutory sexual offense with a person who is 15 years of age or younger in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.30;

c. Sexual activity by a substitute parent or custodian (2 counts) in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.31; and

d. Taking indecent liberties with children (2 counts) in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-202.1.

7. These charges arise out conduct by Mr. Marsh with a 14 year old minor where he was in a position as a custodian. These acts occurred while he was performing official duties as a security guard.

8. The facts underlying the charges indicate a lack of good moral character.

9. Mr. Marsh's charges have not been adjudicated in the criminal courts of Mecklenburg County.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that David Logan Marsh's Unarmed Guard Registration be summarily suspended pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 150B-3(c) upon the Findings of Fact showing that the public health, safety, and welfare will be jeopardized if Mr. Marsh is allowed to continue in his role as an Unarmed Guard for G4S.

By Notice of Hearing dated September 20, 2021, and mailed via certified mail, Respondent advised Petitioner that a hearing on the summary suspension of his unarmed guard registration would be held at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 1711 New Hope Church Road, Raleigh, North Carolina 27609 on October 25, 2021. Petitioner's signature is on the return receipt for the certified mailing dated September 23, 2021. *See* Respondent's Exhibit 4. Petitioner did not appear at the hearing.

8. Mr. Sherwin testified that he determined Petitioner is currently being held in the Mecklenburg County Detention Center.

9. Petitioner's Order of Summary Suspension and Notice of Hearing were admitted into evidence as Respondent's Exhibit 2 and Exhibit 3.

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10. The Warrants for Arrest for Petitioner's six criminal charges above were admitted into evidence as Respondent's Exhibit 1. The charges were sought and obtained by a Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Officer.

11. As of the date of the hearing of this contested case, Petitioner's criminal charges have not been adjudicated and remain pending.

12. Petitioner failed to appear and present evidence to explain why these charges are not considered a threat to the public health, safety, and welfare.

13. By their very nature, these criminal charges constitute a threat to the public health, safety, and welfare.

14. Respondent Board's summary suspension of Petitioner's unarmed guard registration was justified.

PROPOSED CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The parties properly are before the Office of Administrative Hearings. All parties received notice of this hearing in conformance with N.C.G.S. § 150B-38.

2. Respondent Board may deny or suspend a registration if it determined that the applicant has demonstrated intemperate habits or lacks good moral character. N.C.G.S. § 74C-12(a)(25).

3. It is not the function of the Tribunal to determine Petitioner's guilt or innocence of the criminal charges at issue. Rather, the Tribunal simply determines whether Respondent Board acted in conformance with its own administrative rules and otherwise in compliance with the Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable law or rule.

4. The Tribunal has no difficulty determining, given the nature of the charges and the evidence presented at the hearing, that Respondent Board acted lawfully and properly in its action of summary suspension.

PROPOSED FINAL DECISION

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Undersigned hereby recommends that the summary suspension of unarmed guard registration be **UPHELD**.

In addition to service to Petitioner's primary residence, since Petitioner is incarcerated, this Proposed Final Decision and further notifications from the Respondent Board shall be served on him in Mecklenburg County Detention Center.

NOTICE AND ORDER

The North Carolina Private Protective Services Board will make the Final Agency Decision in this contested case. As the Final Decision maker, that agency is required to give each party an opportunity to file exceptions to this proposal for decision, to submit proposed findings of fact, and to present oral and written arguments to the agency pursuant to N.C. THIS ORDER, issued pursuant to authority granted by North Carolina General Statute § 150B-3(c) and North Carolina General Statute § 74C-6, summarily suspends the Unarmed Guard Registration issued to David Logan Marsh of Waxhaw, North Carolina. In support thereof, the Private Protective Services Board's Director finds the following:

STATEMENT OF LAW AND FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The North Carolina Private Protective Services Board is an agency of the State of North Carolina and is created pursuant to the North Carolina Private Protective Services Act, N.C.G.S. § 74C-1 *et seq*.

2. The position of Director of the North Carolina Private Protective Services Board is created pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 74C-6.

3. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 74C-12(a)(25), the Board may, after compliance with Chapter 150B of the General Statutes, deny, suspend or revoke a license or registration issued under this Chapter if it is determined that the registrant demonstrated intemperate habits or a lack of good moral character.

4. Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 74C-6, the Director shall administer the directives contained in the Private Protective Services Act and the rules promulgated by the Board in order to actively police the industry.

5. David Logan Marsh is registered as an unarmed guard with G4S, a licensed Security Guard and Patrol business located at 1 Centerview Drive, Suite 105, Greensboro, NC. Mr. Marsh's registration has an expiration date of May 31, 2022.

6. Investigation has revealed that Mr. Marsh was charged in Mecklenburg County, North Carolina with:

a. Statutory rape of a person who is 15 years of age or younger in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.25;

b. Statutory sexual offense with a person who is 15 years of age or younger in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.30;

c. Sexual activity by a substitute parent or custodian (2 counts) in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-27.31; and

d. Taking indecent liberties with children (2 counts) in violation of N.C.G.S. § 14-202.1.

7. These charges arise out conduct by Mr. Marsh with a 14 year old minor where he was in a position as a custodian. These acts occurred while he was performing official duties as a security guard.

8. The facts underlying the charges indicate a lack of good moral character.

9. Mr. Marsh's charges have not been adjudicated in the criminal courts of Mecklenburg County.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that David Logan Marsh's Unarmed Guard Registration be summarily suspended pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 150B-3(c) upon the Findings of Fact showing that the public health, safety, and welfare will be jeopardized if Mr. Marsh is allowed to continue in his role as an Unarmed Guard for G4S.

An administrative hearing has been scheduled by N.C. Private Protective Services Board to formally examine the allegations specified above. This hearing will be held **Monday**, **October 25, 2021 at 2:00 P.M.** before the Office of Administration Hearings for the Private Protective Services Board and will be conducted in accordance with Administrative Procedures Act, North Carolina General Statute 150B, Article 3A. This proceeding is a contested case hearing and will give you the opportunity to present evidence and cross-examine witnesses. The Board will be represented by Jeffrey P. 
