Management Information System



- Method for J-Wise to communicate with ACIS and/or other adult criminal record information system
- Limited view J-Wise access to determine whether youths should be processed in the juvenile or adult system and to assist with case processing
- Expand J-Wise access to include legal assistants



Dispositional Alternatives

- North Carolina General Statute § 7B-2506
 - The court exercising jurisdiction over a juvenile who has been adjudicated delinquent may use the following alternatives in accordance with the dispositional structure set forth in G.S. 7B-2508:
 - In the case of any juvenile who needs more adequate care or supervision or who needs placement, the judge may:
 - Require the juvenile be supervised in the juvenile's own home
 - Place the juvenile in the custody of a parent, guardian, custodian, etc.
 - Place the juvenile in the custody of the department of social services
