
Implementation Update - HIRING

- Currently hiring 15 field service specialists
 - Train
 - Develop community resources (e.g., vocational education & job devlp.)
 - Quality assurance
- May 2019- 65 new Court Services positions on the job and funneling through BASIC training
 - Complete BASIC by October 18, 2019

Implementation Update - PROCESS


Revising

 - Needs assessment
 - Written resources (scenario driven), job aids (bench cards for judges, reference card for LE, process delineation for Court Counselors)
 - Online & in person training, feedback and evaluation method for CQI
 - Contract in place

 Renovating CA Dillon Cottage D for 30 YDC beds until Rockingham opens in Feb. 2022. CA Dillon Cottage D will transition into transfer (A-Gs) beds at that time.





Rockingham County (YDC)


Approval to Build (Reidsville City Council)

FUNDED


- Planning dollars (NR)
- 65 Court Services positions (R) and setup costs (NR)
- Rockingham YDC facility (NR)

NEED



- Over 400 staff, including Rockingham YDC
- JCPC program (Level 1, 2, 3, and at-risk youth) dollars to include diversion programming for SJPs
- Level 3 and re-entry vocational programming
- Contractual/residential programming
- State share of detention
- Transportation vans
- Electronic monitoring dollars
- C.A. Dillon operating costs
- Videoconferencing
- AOC (5 district court judgeships, 7 district attorney legal assistants and 6 deputy clerks)
- Fund existing AOC staff deficiencies
- Office of Juvenile Defender (2 positions: attorney, contracts administrator)
