




RAISE THE AGE JUVENILES BY MONTH YEAR 1 AND YEAR 2



YEAR 2 (DEC – MAR): RTA JUVENILES AND DETENTION INTAKES → DETENTION





Calendar Year 2020


Race Groups of Non-RtA and RtA Complaints are Not Identical in CY 2020

Discretionary RtA Transfers (Felony Class H & I)

- ▶ 11 juveniles had a most serious offense that was a class H (10) or class I (1)
- ▶ 10 juveniles were age 17 at the time of offense, 1 juvenile was age 16

First 12 Months of Raise the Age A to G Class Only Transfers

Race Group	A to G RtA Transferred Juveniles
Black or AA	70% 167
Hispanic/Latino	34
Other	13
White	24
Total	238

- 70% of transferred juveniles with A-G offenses are Black/African-American.
- 10% are white.
