## Characteristics of the Service Directory

> Online, real time repository of over 2,000 programs
> District Users initiate the addition of a new program via an emailed hyperlink to program entry form to a program provider.
>Look and feel of CJLEADS

- Automated entry update/review requests are sent to program providers every 6 months to keep it up-to-date.
CJLEADS Users (in all CJLEADS user roles) can Search and Print entries via Pdf or Excel.
