

Legislative Update

This week at the General Assembly lawmakers resumed efforts towards finalizing a compromise budget. Though no definitive timeline has been provided, conferees are believed to be making progress as negotiations continue. The legislative affairs team is actively monitoring budget negotiations and expects more details to become available over the next couple of weeks.

Unrelated to the budget, the Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee met Monday to approve draft language for 340B pharmaceutical pricing and disaster recovery. Additionally, the committee heard a follow-up presentation to the May 20th presentation on Hurricane Matthew disaster recovery efforts.

Later Monday afternoon, the Senate Select Committee on Prison Safety met to discuss and adopt its proposed recommendations. Many of the recommendations pertained to recruitment and retention, training, benefits, shift schedules, and promotion policies concerning correctional employees. It is anticipated this committee will meet again, although no future date has been announced.

And finally, of particular significance regarding bills with action this week, House Bill 99, *Transfer ALE*, was heard in two separate committees this week and received favorable reports. The proposed legislation is scheduled to be voted on by the Senate Monday evening. If passed, it will then be sent to the Governor for his signature.
