Legislative Update

Week of March 11, 2019

On Monday, the Senate Select Committee on Prison Safety held its initial meeting in which committee members shared their goals for the committee, and heard an overview of prisons from the General Assembly's fiscal research staff. The next committee meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 18th.

The Joint Appropriations Committee on Justice and Public Safety met Tuesday to receive a presentation on inmate healthcare. On Wednesday, the committee heard an overview on Prisons programs, which included In-Prison Programs, Alcohol and Chemical Dependency Programs, and Correction Enterprises. Office of State Budget and Management staff provided a summary of the justice and public safety items included in the Governor's recommended at Thursday's joint committee meeting.

Also this week, the Senate unanimously passed Senate Bill 105, Federal Motor Carrier Safety/PRISM, which would make various changes to the motor carrier laws and bring North Carolina into compliance with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) requirements. The bill will now undergo the same process in the House.

- (3) Adjournment resolutions.
- (4) Bills introduced on the report of the House Committees on Appropriations, Finance, or Rules.
