Activity on Jones street was steady this week. Although 102 bills were filed, none were DPS bills, which are still in the skillful hands of bill drafters at the General Assembly. We will provide a summary description of these bills when filed.

This week was also filled with appropriations subcommittees meeting to discuss the budgetary needs required for the next biennium. The Joint Appropriations Committee on Justice and Public Safety (JPS) met Tuesday, during which the Fiscal Research team provided a framework for the JPS budget process and then gave a broad overview of DPS. At Thursday's meeting, Fiscal Research began to explore the budgetary nuances of Prisons and inmate medical costs. Next week, the team will conclude its presentation on Prisons and move into both Community Corrections and Juvenile Justice.

- (4) Bills introduced on the report of the House Committees on Appropriations, Finance, or Rules.
