At the risk of sounding like a broken record, it was quiet again this week at the statehouse. The legislative calendar included a handful of Senate committee meetings, with only one House committee meeting. Like the House last week, the Senate this week took up two hot-button issues that have garnered much attention – medical marijuana and high school athletics oversight. Beyond these issues, hearings on policy-related bills came to a standstill. Aside from local bills and bills for concurrence, the Senate held floor votes on a mere three bills this week. Not to be outdone, the House did not vote on any bills.

Next week is scheduled to be another quiet legislative week. The House will only hold floor votes on Monday evening and Tuesday morning. However, the Senate will not vote on any legislation until the first week of August. And finally, there is scuttlebutt that the House budget will be released the second week of August...stay tuned.
