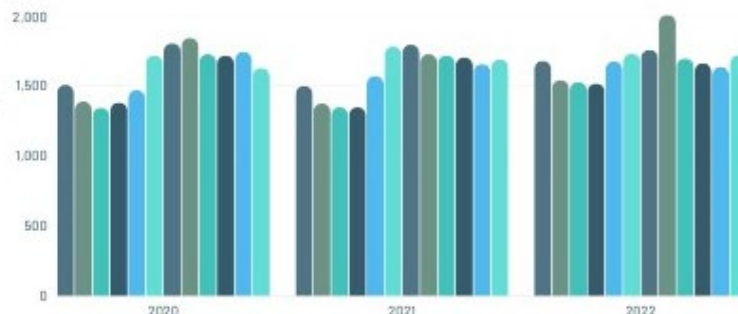


Motor Vehicle Theft in North Carolina, 2020-2022

More than 61,850 motor vehicles were reported stolen in North Carolina between 2020 and 2022, according to the National Incident-Based Reporting System. This publication analyzes vehicle-theft reports and does not include vehicles stolen by way of burglary; breaking and entering; robbery; or carjacking.

Motor Vehicles Stolen by Month

North Carolina saw a slight increase in motor vehicles stolen year-over-year from 2020-2022, with August 2022 having the most of any month (2,009).



On average, over half of all vehicle thefts occurred at a residence or home (51%).



Fewer vehicle thefts were reported per 1,000 N.C. residents than per 1,000 U.S. residents.*



The average age of a victim of vehicle theft was higher (43) than the average reported age of an offender (23).**



A total of 1,023 firearms were reported stolen in vehicle-theft incidents during the reporting period.
