LAWS AND RULES COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee discussed several items. First, the Committee recommended amending Administrative Rule 14B NCAC 16 .0807(h) to clarify that all classroom training must be completed prior to qualifying on the range. Second, the Committee considered a request to allow persons under the age of 21 who are serving in military to be allowed to obtain an armed security guard registration. The Committee recommended not making this change because most N.C. laws related to handgun possession and purchase require a person to be 21 years old.

• On September 15, 2022 P&G Security notified Investigator Bullard of a negligent weapon discharge. The incident occurred on September 14, 2022 at approximately 6:05 a.m. at the Bertie Correctional Institute located in Windsor, North Carolina. According to the report, Security Guard Tashmar Francis was beginning his shift at the prison. Francis went to the clearing barrel outside of the gatehouse, retrieved the Smith & Wesson, M&P 9mm handgun, loaded and charged the handgun. Francis then turned to walk away from the clearing barrel while simultaneously holstering the handgun. The handgun, partially in the holster, discharged one round into the concrete floor beside the clearing barrel. No injuries were reported. The Department of Public Safety was notified.

Investigator Bullard queried PPSM(Permitium) and discovered that Tashmar Francis was a properly registered armed guard and qualified to carry the Smith & Wesson, M&P 9mm handgun. A copy of the report and photographs are included in this file.

On September 19, 2022 Michael Matthews, Qualifying Agent for Capitol Special Patrol, emailed Investigator Bullard to advise of a weapon discharge that occurred on September 17, 2022. According to the email at approximately 4:30 p.m. security guard William Henry was working an armed post at the Carriage Square shopping center located at 6400 Old Pineville Road, Charlotte, North Carolina. Henry heard a disturbance at the Taco Bar. Upon arriving in the vicinity Henry observed four (4) males exit the Taco Bar. Two (2) began walking toward the "Mini-Mart" and two (2) got into a white Nissan Rouge. The Nissan Rouge began traveling toward the "Mini-Mart". An employee of the Taco Bar approached Henry and informed him that the four (4) males were causing a disturbance inside and that they had firearms. Henry began walking toward the Nissan Rouge to obtain the license plate number to report the incident. Henry overheard the passengers of the Nissan Rouge yelling to the two (2) individuals that were on foot "hurry up and get in the car". Henry then heard gun fire coming from the Nissan Rouge. Henry drew his handgun and fired between three and five rounds at the Nissan Rouge, which was still stationary in the parking lot. The Nissan Rouge then fled the area. Henry called 911 and reported the incident. At approximately 6:55 p.m. Charlotte Mecklenburg Police Department located and stopped the white Nissan Rouge. The occupants were in possession of at least one stolen firearm. Several spent shell casings were also located inside of the vehicle. At the time of this report no charges have been filed against Henry. This case is still under investigation by CMPD.

III. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

a. At its December 2021 meeting, and based on a recommendation of the Law and Rules Committee, the Board voted to amend 14B NCAC 16 .0201 to establish a new procedure to allow character letters to be submitted electronically, to amend .0404 to require a Private Investigator to have proof that a requested written report was provided to a client, to repeal an antiquated provision (.0904(a)(4)) requiring payment of a fee for a criminal history record check for renewal of a firearms trainer certificate, and amend all of the Board's "renewal rules" (i.e. .0203, .0706, .0806, .0904, .0911, .1306 and .1406) to allow Board's staff to hold a renewal application if there is a deniable criminal charge pending.

The Notice of Text was filed January 10, 2022. The Public Hearing was held Tuesday, February 22, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board's office. The Public Comment Period expired April 4, 2022. There were no comments, oral or written. The Board voted to approve these rule amendments at its April 21, 2022 meeting. The Submission for Permanent Rule forms were filed May 11, 2022. The Rules Review Commission's Staff Attorney who reviewed these rules had questions, but no Requests for Technical Changes. They were considered by the Commission at its June 16th meeting and approved. A copy was attached to my August 18, 2022 Attorney's Report.

b. At its February 2022 meeting, and based on a recommendation of the Training and Education Committee, the Board voted to amend 14B NCAC 16 .0806, .0904 and .0911 to extend by 30 days (i.e. from 60 to 90 days) the renewal deadlines for firearm registration permits and firearm trainer certificates during the time of a declared state of emergency. This extension (i.e. 60 days) was first adopted as emergency, then temporary and finally permanent rule amendments and were effective January 1, 2022. These rule amendments will now afford the same extension (90 days) for an unarmed trainer certificate in new .0911(d).

The Notice of Text was filed February 25, 2022. The Public Hearing was Tuesday, April 26, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board's office and the Public Comment Period expired May 31, 2022. There were no comments oral or written.

The Board voted to approve the amendments to 14B NCAC 16 .0806 and .0904 at its June 16th meeting. The Submission for Permanent Rule forms were filed August 10, 2022.

c. At its April 21, 2022 meeting the Board voted to clarify that the 90 day restriction in 14B NCAC 16 .0807(e) for training prior to registration only applies to the initial training. Also, the words "private detective" are being removed from the definition of "Armed Security Guard" in 14B NCAC 16 .0103.

The Notice of Text was filed June 1, 2022. The Public Hearing was held Tuesday, July 19, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. at the Board's office. The Public Comment Period expired August 30, 2022. There were no comments, written or oral. A copy of these rule amendments is attached as Attachment 2.

A vote to approve these rule amendments is in order for today's meeting.

IV. LITIGATION

a. At its February 18, 2021 meeting the Board instructed me to file a Motion to Show Cause as to William John Haglar, an unlicensed private investigator who entered into a Consent Order in Wake County Superior Court in 2014 that he would not engage in any activity defined by Chapter 74C of the General Statutes as a "private protective service" in the State of North Carolina. Mr. Haglar has been caught performing private investigator services as recent as December 2020.

After confirming with the attorney who had filed an Affidavit of Service in a domestic case stating Mr. Haglar was a "private investigator," that Mr. Haglar was not the attorney's agent or employee, I filed the Motion on March 30, 2021. Mr. Haglar was served at an addresses in Florida and acknowledged receipt of the Motion by letter.

I noticed a hearing on the Motion for August 2, 2021. Mr. Haglar did not appear, however the presiding Judge granted the Motion and Mr. Haglar was ordered to appear and show cause as to why he should not be held in civil or criminal contempt on August 30, 2021. Having been unsuccessful in serving him by certified mail, I hired a private process server in the State of Florida who was unsuccessful in serving Mr. Haglar. I had to obtain a new court date, which was Monday, October 11, 2021. This time I successfully had him served by the Sheriff of Palm Beach County, Florida. At his hearing on October 11th Mr. Haglar did not personally appear; he retained an attorney the previous Friday to appear on his behalf. I objected to a continuance, but since a person must be personally present for a judge to hold him or her in indirect contempt, the presiding Judge continued the hearing but entereded an order that Mr. Haglar personally appear on November 15, 2021 or an order for arrest would be issued.

Mr. Haglar did not appear on the November 15th hearing date, but his attorney appeared on his behalf stating he was in the Mayo Clinic in Phoenix, Arizona having had emergency surgery and had suffered a heart attack. The presiding Judge, at my request, required proof. Later in the day Mr. Haglar's attorney provided a letter signed by a physician, an Affidavit, and a photograph of Mr. Haglar lying in a hospital bed. The Judge did not issue the warrant for arrest, and continued the hearing.

The hearing was recalendared for January 31, 2022. Mr. Haglar and his attorney appeared, however the hearing was continued to allow time for a hearing on objections to the subpoena I issued to the attorney who filed the Affidavit of Service in the domestic case stating Mr. Haglar was a "Private Investigator." That hearing was calendared for March 7th, virtually, but was continued due to "technical issues." It was re-calendared for April 25, 2022, at which time the Judge entered an Order compelling the attorney's testimony.

Mr. Haglar's attorney advised me he was going to move to withdraw from representation of him. However when he did not do so after a reasonable time I noticed the hearing for August 8, 2022. Mr. Haglar's attorney appeared at the hearing (as did the attorney who signed the Affidavit of Service as ordered), but Mr. Haglar was not present. His attorney presented a letter from a doctor stating Mr. Haglar had health issues and could not travel; he moved to continue the hearing. Following argument from counsel on the motion, and in light of the letter being from a dermatologist (!), the Judge denied the continuance and issued an Order for Arrest.

b. At its April 21, 2022 meeting the Board instructed me to file a Complaint for Injunctive Relief against Raymond Burroughs, d/b/a Ultimate Protection and Staffing, and also "Ultimate Protection, LLC" (neither of which is a legal entity in N.C.), for operating an unlicensed Security Guard and Patrol business in the Durham area.

The Complaint was filed on May 8, 2022 and served by the Durham County Sheriff's Office on July 7, 2022. Mr. Burroughs failed to answer or otherwise plead. I obtained Entry of Default on July 2nd and filed and served a Motion for Default Judgment on August 5, 2022. Mr. Burroughs did not answer within 30 days therefore I was allowed to obtain judgment (i.e. an injunction) without a hearing before a Judge. A Default Judgment Order imposing the injunction was signed September 14, 2022. c. In July 2016, Steven M. Andiloro and Professional Security Solutions, LLC entered into a Consent Order whereby Mr. Andiloro agreed he would cease engaging in the Security Guard and Patrol business without a license. He also agreed to dissolve his limited liability company. It was discovered this Spring he had done neither. At the Board's April 2022 meeting I was instructed to seek an Order to Show Cause as to why he should not be held in contempt for violating the provisions of the Consent Order.

A Motion for Order to Show Cause was filed and served on May 17, 2022, and after some false starts with his original attorney, a Superior Court Judge signed and entered an Order for Show Cause. Mr. Andiloro retained a (new) attorney and the hearing has twice been continued for medical emergencies in Mr. Andiloro's family. It was set for hearing for August 22, 2022, but prior to the hearing, and upon proof he had dissolved Professional Security Solutions, LLC and shut down his website (securitysolutionsforyou.com), Mr. Andiloro entered into a second Consent Order wherein he agreed to 30 days confinement in the Wake County Detention Center, suspended on the condition he serve 24 hours active confinement in the Iredell County jail facility (if agreed to by the Sheriff of Iredell County) and he be placed on five (5) years supervised probation. Any future violation of the Board's law and rules will result in the revocation of the probation and activation of the remaining 29 days.

As an interesting note, it was discovered after the April Grievance Committee meeting that Mr. Andiloro, in the name of Professional Security Solutions, LLC, applied for and obtained a PPE loan, on May 6, 2020 in the amount of \$1,729,166.00.

d. At its June 16, 2022 meeting the Board instructed me to file a Complaint for Injunctive Relief against Franco Khristian Webb d/b/a Global Security, Webb Security Global and/or Webb Security (none of which are legal entities in N.C.) for engaging in the Security Guard and Patrol business and performing Private Investigator activities without a license.

The Complaint was filed on June 27, 2022 and was returned by the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office unserved ("unable to locate") on July 15th. I obtained an Alias & Pluries Summons and was successful with service through FedEx on August 10, 2022. Mr. Webb failed to answer or otherwise plead. I obtained Entry of Default on September 14th and filed and served a Motion for Default Judgment on September 20, 2022. If Mr. Webb does not answer within 30 days (i.e. today, October 20th) I can obtain judgment (i.e. an injunction) without a hearing before a Judge.

e. At its October 2020 meeting the Board entered its Final Agency Decision in the matter of Nickolas Scott Chatham denying his application for a Private Investigator Associate license. Director Sherwin and I, both, received indications Mr. Chatham intended to petition for judicial review. Such a petition, by statute, must be filed in the county of the petitioner's residence. Mr. Chatham had a High Point, NC address on his application. Not having received anything from him I checked the Guilford County Clerk of Court filings in early 2021 and discovered nothing.

On July 20, 2022 the Board office received a Trial Calendar from Alamance County for a "status report" for a complaint (not a petition) filed by Mr. Chatham in January 2021. Evidently it has been on previous calendars for a status report, but since there was no address for Mr. Chatham or the Board included with his complaint we never received notice.

I have filed a Motion to Dismiss but the Trial Court Coordinator advised me that I had to first appear at the August 15, 2022 status report hearing before I could calendar the Motion to Dismiss, which I did. The Board's Motion to Dismiss was heard and granted on September 26, 2022. Although sent a Notice of Hearing by me, and a Motions Calendar by the Court, Mr. Chatham did not appear.

V. LEGISLATION

Senate Bill 424, "Private Protective Services Licensing Modifications" passed the General Assembly on July 1, 2022 and was signed by the Governor on July 8, 2022.

The Law & Rules Committee has begun the process of formulating recommendations to the full Board for administrative rule amendments and adoptions, including creating two subcommittees, one for the new Close Personal Protection license and a second on for the new Digital Forensics Examiner license. Each of these subcommittees has had an initial meeting.

VI. FINAL AGENCY DECISIONS

SECTION .0800 - ACCREDITATION OF JUSTICE OFFICER SCHOOLS AND TRAINING COURSES

12 NCAC 10B.0803 REPORTS/DETENTION OFFICER CERT COURSE

PRESENTATION/COMPLETION

Each presentation of the Detention Officer Certification Course shall be reported to the Commission as follows:

- (1) After acquiring accreditation for the course and before commencing each delivery of the course, the school director shall, no less than 30 days prior to the scheduled delivery, notify the Division of the school's intent to offer the training course by submitting a Pre-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation (Form F-7A); and
- (2) Upon completing delivery of the accredited course, and not more than ten days after receiving from the Commission's representative the Report of Examination Scores, the school director shall notify the Division regarding the progress and achievement of each enrolled trainee by submitting a Post-Delivery Report of Training Course Presentation (Form F-7B). This report shall also include each trainee's reading grade level as determined by testing required in 12 NCAC 10B .0601(e).

CHAPTER 16 - PRIVATE PROTECTIVE SERVICES, BOARD

SECTION .0100 - ORGANIZATION AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

14B NCAC 16 .0103 DEFINITIONS

In addition to the definitions set forth in G.S. 74C, the following definitions shall apply throughout this Subchapter:

- (1) "Agency Head" means the Chairman of the Board.
- (2) "Applicant" means any person, firm, or corporation applying to the Board for a license, trainee permit, registration, or firearms trainer certificate.

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- (3) "Armed Private Security Guard" means an individual employed, full time or part time, by a contract security company or a proprietary security organization:
 - (a) who at any time wears, carries, or possesses a firearm in the performance of his or her duties; and
 - (b) whose principal duty is that of:
 - (i) an armed security guard, officer, patrol, or watchman;
 - (ii) an armed armored car service guard; guard; or
 - (iii) a private detective; or
 - (iv)(iii) an armed courier service guard.
- (4) "Board" means the Private Protective Services Board established by G.S. 74C.
- (5) "Branch Manager or Operator" means the individual endowed with the responsibility and liability for a branch office.
- (6) "Branch Office" means a separate but dependent part of a central organization engaged in the business of providing private protective services established for the purpose of extending the activities of the central organization. The establishment of a telephone number or mailing address in the company name constitutes prima facie evidence of a branch office. If an out-of-state person, firm, association, or corporation opens an office in North Carolina, the North Carolina office shall be deemed the principal place of business and shall have a resident licensed qualifying agent.
- (7) "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Private Protective Services Board.
- (8) "Contract Security Company" means any person, firm, association, or corporation engaging in a private protective services business as defined in G.S. 74C-3 that provides the services on a contractual basis for a fee or other valuable consideration to any other person, firm, association, or corporation.
- (9) "Direct Supervision" means personal, face-toface contact and direction of the trainee's activities on a frequent and reasonable basis based upon the trainee's level of experience.
- (10) "Investigative Capacity" means any law enforcement agency position for which the duties include conducting investigations and interviews, completing reports, and testifying in courts, administrative hearings, or military tribunals.
- (11) "Law Enforcement Officer" means a sworn peace officer who has the power of arrest, and who is an employee of the United States, any state, or any political subdivision of a state.
- (12) "Licensee" means any person licensed to perform private protective services in North Carolina in accordance with G.S. 74C.

- (13) "Proprietary Security Organization" means any person, firm, association, corporation, or department that employs watchmen, security guards or "officers," patrol personnel, or couriers in connection with the business affairs of the employer.
- (14) "Qualifying Agent" means the individual licensee who is responsible for the private protective services business. If the licensee maintains an office in North Carolina, the Qualifying Agent must be a resident of North Carolina.
- (15) "Registered agent" means the individual resident of North Carolina designated by the business entity in lieu of the Qualifying Agent as allowed by G.S. 74C-8(c)(1) who may be, but is not required to be, the registered agent required by G.S. 55D-30.
- (16) "Restored" means that an individual is no longer in need of psychiatric care as determined by a physician.
- (17) "Temporary unarmed security guard" means an individual who is hired for a period of 30 days or less within a calendar year and who is designated by his or her employer as a temporary security guard at the start of employment.

Authority G.S. 74C-3; 74C-5; 74C-8.

SECTION .0800 - ARMED SECURITY GUARD FIREARM REGISTRATION PERMIT

14B NCAC 16.0807 TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR ARMED SECURITY GUARDS

(a) Applicants for an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall first complete the basic unarmed security guard training course set forth in Rule .0707 of this Chapter.

(b) Private investigator licensees applying for an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall first complete a five-hour training course consisting of the courses set forth in Rule .0707(a)(1) and (2) of this Chapter and all additional training requirements set forth in that Rule.

(c) Applicants for an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall complete a basic training course for armed security guards which consists of at least 20 hours of classroom instruction including:

- legal limitations on the use of handguns and on the powers and authority of an armed security guard, including familiarity with rules and regulations relating to armed security guards (minimum of four hours);
- (2) handgun safety, including range firing procedures (minimum of one hour);
- (3) handgun operation and maintenance (minimum of three hours);
- (4) handgun fundamentals (minimum of eight hours); and
- (5) night firing (minimum of four hours).

Subparagraph (c)(2), "operation" under Subparagraph (c)(3), and Subparagraph (c)(4) of this Rule shall be completed prior to the applicant's participation in range firing.

(d) Applicants for an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall attain a score of at least 80 percent accuracy on a firearms range qualification course adopted by the Board and the Secretary of Public Safety, a copy of which is on file in the Director's office, once in three consecutive attempts. Should a student fail to attain a score of 80 percent accuracy, the student may be given a second opportunity to qualify once in three consecutive attempts on the course of fire the student did not pass. Failure to qualify after the second series of attempts shall require the student to repeat the entire basic training course for armed security guards. All attempts must take place within 20 days of the completion of the initial 20 hour course. For rifle qualification all shots shall be located on the target.

(e) All initial armed security guard training required by this Chapter shall be administered by a certified trainer and shall be completed no more than 90 days prior to the date of issuance of the armed security guard firearm registration permit.

(f) All applicants for an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall obtain training under the provisions of this Section using their duty weapon and their duty ammunition or ballistic equivalent ammunition, to include lead-free ammunition that meets the same point of aim, point of impact, and felt recoil of the duty ammunition, for all weapons.

(g) No more than six new or renewal armed security guard applicants per one instructor shall be placed on the firing line at any one time during firearms range training for armed security guards.

(h) Applicants for re-certification of an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall complete a basic recertification training course for armed security guards that consists of at least four hours of classroom instruction and is a review of the requirements set forth in Subparagraphs (c)(1) through (c)(5) of this Rule. The recertification course is valid for 180 days after completion of the course. Applicants for recertification of an armed security guard firearm registration permit shall also complete the requirements of Paragraph (d) of this Rule.

(i) An armed guard registered with one company may be registered with a second company. The registration shall be considered "dual." The registration with the second company shall expire at the same time that the registration expires with the first company. An updated application shall be required to be submitted by the applicant, along with the digital photograph, updated criminal records checks, and a forty dollar (\$40.00) registration fee. If the guard will be carrying a firearm of the same make, model, and caliber, then no additional firearms training shall be required. The licensee shall submit a letter stating the guard will be carrying the same make and model firearm. If the guard will be carrying a firearm of a different make and model, the licensee shall submit a letter to the Board advising of the make, model, and caliber of the firearm the guard will be carrying and the guard shall be required to qualify at the firing range on both the day and night qualification course. The qualification score is valid for 180 days after completion of the course.

(j) To be authorized to carry a standard 12 gauge shotgun in the performance of his or her duties as an armed security guard, an applicant shall complete, in addition to the requirements of Paragraphs (a), (c), and (d) of this Rule, six hours of classroom training that shall include the following:

- legal limitations on the use of shotgun (1)(minimum of one hour);
- (2)shotgun safety, including range firing procedures (minimum of one hour);
- (3)shotgun operation and maintenance (minimum of one hour);
- (4)shotgun fundamentals (minimum of two hours); and
- (5)night firing (minimum of one hour).

Subparagraph (j)(2), "operation" under Subparagraph (j)(3), and Subparagraph (j)(4) of this Rule shall be completed prior to the applicant's participation in range firing.

(k) An applicant may take the additional shotgun training at a time after the initial training in this Rule. If the shotgun training is completed at a later time, the shotgun certification shall run concurrent with the armed registration permit. In addition to the requirements set forth in Paragraph (j) of this Rule, applicants shall attain a score of at least 80 percent accuracy on a shotgun range qualification course adopted by the Board and the Secretary of Public Safety, a copy of which is on file in the Director's office. (1) Applicants for shotgun recertification shall complete one hour of classroom training covering the topics set forth in Paragraph (i) of this Rule and shall also complete the requirements of Paragraph (d) of this Rule,

(m) To be authorized to carry a rifle in the performance of his or her duties as an armed security guard, an applicant shall complete, in addition to the requirements of Paragraphs (a), (c), and (d) of this Rule, 16 hours of classroom training which shall include the following:

- (1)legal limitations on the use of rifles (minimum of one hour);
- rifle safety, including range firing procedures (2)(minimum of one hour);
- rifle operation and maintenance (minimum of (3)two hours);
- rifle fundamentals (minimum of ten hours); and (4)

(5) night firing (minimum two hours).

Subparagraph (m)(2), "operation" under Subparagraph (m)(3), and Subparagraph (m)(4) of this Rule shall be completed prior to the applicant's participation in range firing.

(n) The applicant shall pass a skills course that tests each basic rifle skill and the test of each skill shall be completed within three attempts.

(o) An applicant may take the additional rifle training at a time after the initial training in this Rule. If the rifle training is completed at a later time, the rifle certification shall run concurrent with the armed registration permit. In addition to the requirements set forth in Paragraphs (m) and (n) of this Rule, applicants shall attain a score of at least 80 percent accuracy on a rifle range qualification course adopted by the Board and the Secretary of Public Safety, a copy of which is on file in the Director's office.

Applicants for rifle recertification shall complete an (p) additional one hour of classroom training covering the topics set forth in Paragraph (m) of this Rule and shall also complete the requirements of Paragraph (d) of this Rule.

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PROPOSED RULES

(q) Upon written request, an applicant for an armed security guard firearm registration permit who possesses a current firearms trainer certificate shall be given a firearms registration permit that will run concurrent with the trainer certificate upon completion of an annual qualification with the applicant's duty firearms as set forth in Paragraph (d) of this Rule.

(r) An armed security guard is required to qualify annually both for day and night firing with his or her duty handgun, shotgun, and rifle, if applicable. If the security guard fails to qualify on any course of fire, the security guard shall not carry the firearm until such time as he or she meets the qualification requirements. Upon failure to qualify, the firearm instructor shall notify the security guard that he or she is no longer authorized to carry the firearm and the firearm instructor shall notify the employer and the Private Protective Services Board staff on the next business day.

(s) A firearm training certificate of an armed security guard remains valid even if the guard leaves the employment of one company for the employment of another. The range qualifications shall remain valid if the guard will be carrying a firearm of the same make, model, and caliber and no additional firearms training shall be required. The licensee shall submit a letter stating the guard will be carrying the same make and model firearm. If the guard will be carrying a firearm of a different make and model, the licensee shall submit a letter to the Board advising of the make, model, and caliber of the firearm the guard will be carrying and the guard shall be required to qualify at the firing range on both the day and night qualification course. The qualification score is valid for 180 days after completion of the course. However, nothing herein shall extend the period of time the qualification is valid.

SUBCHAPTER 32A - ORGANIZATION

PETITION FOR RULE-MAKING 21 NCAC 32A .0115 (a) Any person submitting a petition to adopt, amend, or repeal a rule by the Board shall address a petition to the Board's Rule Making Coordinator at the office address in 21 NCAC 32A .0101.

- The petition shall contain the following: (1)
 - for petitions to adopt or amend a rule, (A) a draft of the proposed rule or amendment;
 - (B) a statement of the effect of the requested rule change; and
 - the name and address of the petitioner. <u>(C)</u> <u>(2)</u>
 - The petition may contain the following:
 - the reason for the proposal; <u>(A)</u> the effect of the new rule on existing <u>(B)</u> rules; or

(C) any data supporting the rule proposal.

(b) Within 120 days of submission of the petition, the Board shall render a final decision. If the decision is to grant the petition, the Board shall initiate a rule-making proceeding by issuing a notice as provided for in G.S. 150B-20(c). If the decision is to deny the petition, the Board shall send the petitioner written notice of the decision. The notice shall state the reasons for denying the petition and refer to the appeal rights set forth in G.S. 150B-20(d).
