The degree combines criminal justice theory with practice in order to prepare students for careers in the following areas: state and federal law enforcement, state and federal corrections, juvenile justice, emergency management, risk management, private security, homeland security, customs and immigration, and work in the court system.

EAGLE - VOYAGE

Earn an associate's degree and bachelor's degree with the convenience of classes closer to home.

The Eagle Voyage B.S. degree in Criminal Justice is an accelerated degree program designed to be completed in two years.

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ACCELERATED

Students entering with an associate's degree, can complete a B.S. degree in Criminal Justice in just eight, eight-week mini sessions plus one, five-week summer session.



ACCESSIBLE

Courses are taught in a hybrid format meeting only one day per week at VGCC. Additional work is completed online via Blackboard, a Learning Management System.

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ABOUT OUR PROGRAM

The Criminal Justice Program began in 1972 and became the Department of Criminal Justice in 1992. Its graduate program was established in 1984. The department serves more than 600 undergraduate Criminal Justice majors and is home to two centers of excellence: the Juvenile Justice Institute and the Institute for Homeland Security and Workforce Development. In addition to the core criminal justice curriculum, for distance education students the department offers concentration areas in Homeland Security, Law Enforcement and Corrections. These areas of study provide students with specialized study including policy, theory and practice.

The undergraduate distance education program was established in 1999 in collaboration with the N.C. State Highway Patrol. Today, the distance education program offers a seamless transition for community college transfer students with an associate's degree who want to earn the Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS
