RtA Trends

- Greater than expected A-G juveniles
- Decline in RtA complaints began March 2020, and is beginning to increase again
- 13% of CY 2020 to date RtA complaints are schoolbased
- Guilford County (794), Wake County (772), and Mecklenburg County (678) have the most RtA complaints this calendar year.
- The majority of the crimes during the pandemic are property crimes

Removal of Juveniles from Jails S.L. 2020-83 (H593)

NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

Scope

- Offense occurred on/after August 1, 2020
- New sentence imposed on/after August 1, 2020
- New imprisonment ordered on or after August 1, 2020 (includes probation violations for offenses occurring prior to Aug 1 as well as court orders)

During Stay

- Provide the same services, incentive programming, access to medical or MH/educ/vocational/ recreation/phone calls/visitation, etc. that you provide to any youth under juvenile jurisdiction.
- JJ is exploring various programming to meet the long-term stay needs of some criminal court youth as well as specialized programming based on offense.





Systemwide Steps

- Updated NC-JOIN to admit criminal court youth to detention
 - Detention reasons
 - Billing
 - Attach adult orders
- Worked with AOC to create reference sheet for clerks to fax paperwork
- Delineated forms by detention reason group
 - Pre-trial
 - Probation violation and/or modification
 - Sentenced
 - Held in contempt or failed to pay fine
- Created criminal court youth policy on escapes, detoxification, and confidentiality of records



Training & Resources

- Worked w/UNC-School of Government to provide virtual training to detention directors and detention supervisors
- UNC-SOG created training video and blog:
