The study area will include approximately 6 (six) square miles upstream and downstream of May's Lake where flooding has occurred on public and private property. The study area is approximately 6 square miles consisting of approximately 85% Medium Density Residential, 10% High Density Residential, and 5% General Businesses and Institutional.

How will the mitigation activity be implemented?

The City of Burlington will hire a consultant to perform a watershed analysis to determine the most practicable and beneficial mitigation project in which to implement. The May's Lake Watershed Analysis will include a hydrologic and hydraulic study performed on the identified sub-watershed of May's Lake and Little Alamance Creek. A report of the results and project alternative recommendations will be submitted to the City by the consultant. A cost analysis for the alternatives will also be included to guide the City through the project selection process. Once the most beneficial alternatives are identified, the City will prioritize and budget appropriately during future budget years.

What is the scope of work of the proposal? Will it result in a complete project application for future funding opportunities?

This analysis will lead to a BRIC-eligible construction project by providing the City with stormwater quality and quantity project options that are recommended based on the gathered data collected from this analysis. The City of Burlington is seeking funds to assist in the hiring of a consultant to perform a watershed analysis within May's Lake Watershed. The results of the watershed analysis is to include the current scope of flooding, geomorphological conditions and potential changes during specified storm events. The report will also include recommendations for potential water quality and quantity projects to minimize future impacts from increased frequency of high intensity storm events. Based on the study results, the City can reference the project recommendations in the stormwater Capital Improvement Plan and prioritize recommendations based on the projected benefits of each solution. The results of the watershed analysis will provide the City with alternatives from which to select and request for bids for design. The City can apply for future funding for construction of the selected alternative(s) based on the results of this project.

The project will be managed by Amy Barber, Stormwater Manager and Bob Patterson, Water Resources Director for the City of Burlington.

Additional risks in the project area will be observed and considered in the final report from the hired consultant once the watershed analysis is compiled.

Is there an estimate for when the mitigation activity will take place?

It is estimated to hire a consultant to begin surveying and field data compilation by Summer 2023 with a full report of recommendations by February 2024.

What alternatives will be considered?

Due to the high amount of sediment being transported by Little Alamance Creek and two additional tributaries, the lake depth has decreased to approximately 18"-24" in the deepest parts. As a result, waters of higher temperature and lower dissolved oxygen are being releasing into Little Alamance Creek. The ideal project will include bio-engineered solutions to increase nutrient uptake, decrease outflow temperature, increase dissolved oxygen, while providing wildlife habitat to the lake.

Do activities being considered align with hazard mitigation plan?

The goals of the study are to implement measures within the studied watershed that will decrease the effects of flooding upstream and downstream of May's Lake following high-intensity or prolonged rain events. By doing so, the City of Burlington is demonstrating a firm commitment to improving community health and safety and reducing future vulnerability through wise development. Both of these demonstrations are aligned with the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The City of Burlington is in partnership with North Carolina Department of Transportation (NC DOT) and the City of Graham to administer a Category 4b Demonstration Plan in the Little Alamance Creek Watershed. The goal of the plan is to address impairments in Little Alamance Creek through the implementation of stormwater controls and community outreach. The outflow of the May's Lake, the continuation of Little Alamance Creek, flows under US HWY 70 approximately 0.5 miles downstream of the project. The City has received a Letter of Support from NC DOT for the retrofitting of May's Lake as part of our commitment to enhancing Little Alamance Creek in support of a stormwater project of this scale which will affect NC DOT infrastructure and adhere to the commitment to enhancing the water quality of Little Alamance Creek.
