Hertford County, located in North Carolina's Coastal Plain region also known as the Inner Banks, was formed from annexations of Bertie, Chowan and Northampton counties in 1759. Communities in the County include the County seat of Winton (originally Wynntown [incorporated in 1766], which

replaced Cotton's Ferry), Ahoskie, Murfreesboro, Harrellsville, Como and Cofield. As a part of northeastern North Carolina, Hertford County is a vital contributor to the breadbasket of the State with the region producing peanuts, corn, cotton, potatoes as well as numerous other crops and livestock vital to North Carolina's economy. The Meherrin and Wiccacon Rivers drain much of the interior of the County eastward toward the Chowan River. Some watersheds on the on the western side of the County drain toward the Roanoke River. The Chowan River is navigable year-round offering recreational opportunities and serving as a scenic regional attraction. Hertford County is approximately 353 square miles boarded to the north by the Virginia state line, to the east by Chowan and Gates counties, to the south by Bertie County and to the west by Northampton County.

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Based on the findings from the 2022 Hertford County Resilience Strategy commissioned by the Board of Commissioners and managed by the Planning Director, there are eight high priority projects. In consultation with staff and referencing the findings, three projects have been identified as crucial/critical for the community. Hydrologic Watershed Assessment to identify infrastructure improvement projects to reduce flooding, establish best practices for water management and maintenance with the highest return on investment. The geographic area of the project scope spans the vast majority of Hertford County with the exception of watersheds already evaluated in the southwest portion of the County. The hazard(s) address by the project include precipitation based flooding as well as runoff. The estimated project cost is \$150,000 with a projected timeline of one year. The anticipated benefit is that there would be a significant and positive impact on the risk reduction. The Clearance of Debris from Waterways project scope includes inspect for debris blockage problems, map blockages with priority assignment, direct funds to clear debris from rivers, streams and tributaries, where indicated based on the hydrologic watershed assessment to attain the highest return on investment. The geographic area of the project scope spans Hertford County. The hazard(s) address by the project include precipitation based flooding as well as runoff. The estimated project cost is \$500,000 with a project timeline of six months for the initial clearing followed by ongoing clearing on an as needed basis. The anticipated benefit is that there would be a significant and positive impact on the risk reduction. Countywide Water Storage Upgrades - there is a significant probability that the County could face water shortages if wells were to be forced offline during a natural disaster. The project scope would include identifying the vulnerabilities and implementing measures to reduce the risk. The project will identify suitable sites, install wells, storage tanks and other means of retaining water. This

redundancy will make the County more resilient during future natural disasters. The geographic area of the project scope spans Hertford County.
